

Strengths:

- We have sufficient land with an extent of around 17 acres.
- The institution has its own building.
- The Institution has good number of 775 students in Eleven Courses.
- Apart from Conventional Courses, we have restructured courses like B.Com (Computer Applications and B.Sc (Computer Science). We are also having UGC Add-on courses (Web Design and Computer Networking).
- The Institution has 29 sanctioned posts in which 23 members are Regular Lecturers, 1 member is Contract Faculty and also 07 Guest faculty working in the Institution,
- ✤ 17 members are having Ph.D Degree.
- College has JKC which imparts employable Skills to the students.

Weaknesses:

- ✤ We need 24 Classrooms to run all the programmes. But at present, we have only 15 classrooms, since Government Polytechnic Campus is also running in the same campus.
- ✤ Dropout rate is 5%.
- As the institution is located in the backward area, the socio-economic conditions of the parents are low.
- ✤ Majority of the students are first generation students.

Opportunities:

- In addition to Jawahar Knowledge Centre (JKC), Skill Development Centre was also established in our college. By using these two opportunities we will enhance the employability skills of the students.
- The institution has meagre dropout rate of 5%. It may be minimised by conducting various need based certificate courses like Spoken English, and Communication Skills etc.., which attracts the students towards College and the parents are enlightened about this issue.
- By improving basic infrastructure of the college, we will be in a position to enhance the quality education.
- Virtual classes facility for all the semesters of all the courses.

Threats:

As public evinces more interest in technical education the feature of general education is facing several problems. Majority of the intelligent students of the qualifying examination prefer to join Technical courses, like B.Tech and only average or below average pupils only seek admission in general education.

BEST PRACTICES

Floral arrangement

This training of decoration, beautification, bouquet making is undertaken in the Institution.

- 1. Goal: The main object of this practice is they can keep their homes clean, tidy and in a well decorated way. We feel that making women students aware of home decoration, beautification, bouquet making is the first priority and remains for lifelong. Hence we taught the women students the technique and the methods of floral arrangement. It also creates and aesthetic sense in their households. This training also creates an opportunity for them to exploit their skill for commercial purpose.
- 2. The Context: Since the students come from rural poor and illiterate background, they may not be aware of many things that are related to richness. Beautification and decoration, housekeeping are such practices related to rich people. Today's girls are tomorrow's home makers. Therefore it is thought that if these skills are taught to them, they may benefit from the skills in future. Hence it is decided to take up training the women students in floral arrangement.
- **3. Practice:** The women students are asked to collect various types of flowers available from their surroundings, both wild and grown in gardens. In response this and the students brought many varieties of flowers. The women Faculty of the Women empowerment cell/Eco club taught them the techniques of floral arrangement and bouquet making. These skills were used when the students made floral arrangement for the Seminars/Workshops/other function conducted in the institution.
- 4. Evidence of success: The students were enthusiastic throughout their training period. All the floral arrangement s made during the functions and the flower bouquets handed over to the Dignitaries are prepared by the students. This arrangement saved the Organizers thousands of rupees. Many people appreciated the efforts taken by the students in the Stage and in the hall floral arrangement.
- **5. Problems encountered:** In the beginning the students were very slow in learning as they hail from a rural background. But women are naturally adept in learning flower arrangement techniques. This floral arrangement skill is taught in cities only and the art belong to urban areas. But as the students have shown much patience and developed the flower arrangement skills.
- **6.** Note: It is one of the efforts of the Women empowerment cell to create a dignified way of teaching a skill to women students to exploit the skill for commercial use.

PART – B ANNEXURE AQAR 2017-18 FEED BACK ANALYSIS (CRITERION – I)

A total of 100 Students, Alumni and Parents are given different questionnaires and feedback is taken from them.

1. <u>STUDENTS:</u> Regarding class rooms and infrastructure, 78% of the students expressed those facilities are good. Regarding NSS and NCC 65% of the students expressed that they are good. Regarding completion of syllabus, interest generated by the Faculty, depth and content of the subject and different teaching methods used, majority of the students felt that they are very good.

In case of Curricular, extracurricular activities in the College and regarding Sports/Games facilities, majority of the students expressed that they are good. All the students opined that the Library and learning resources in the college are very good.

2. <u>PARENTS:</u> Most of the parents belong to the Agriculture sector and only a few are self employed. Majority of the parents expressed that the Courses offered and facilities in the College are useful to their wards. They also expressed good opinion about the Infrastructure facilities available in the Institution. They also expressed that implementation of reservations in the admissions is good. Regarding safety of Women students and implementation of anti ragging measures is good.
