The objectives of this project are as follows


- 1. To know whether position of alcoholism
- 2. To trace out the economic status of the people in the village.
- 3. To identify the alcoholism persons.
- 4. To asses severity of alcohol habit the area.
- 5. To analyse the sources of availability of alcohol to the adictors.

Methodology

The study is based on Primary and Secondary data. The primary data is elicited from thesample respondents through a specially designed structured questionnaire by personal interview method. In addition, the secondary data is collected from various websites.

Sample Design

25 families are randomly selected in the village to collect data. Questionnaire is pre-structured, closed and open-ended questions. All sections, both male and female is in sample collection.

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Findings

The following findings identified in my project work are:

- 1. In my study majority of persons addicted to alcohol habit.
- 2. I found majority of alcohol takers belongs to labour community.
- 3. Majority respondents said daily taking alcohol relief from physical work.
- 4. Some of the respondents said taking drink as part of habit.
- 5. I identified some of the persons suffered from various diseases due to alcoholism.
- 6. I also found that all families disturbed economically due to alcoholism.
- 7. I trace out that alcoholism leads to social problems like family disputes, woman harassment etc.
- 8. I found faced physical injuries in accident during drunken drive.
- 9. Another finding is spoiled the future of children in the alcoholism families.

Suggestions

- 1. The Constitution itself has provisions for bringing in alcohol prohibition in India. Article 47 of the Directive Principles of State Policy states that "the State shall endeavour to bring about prohibition of the consumption except for medicinal purposes of intoxicating drinks and of drugs which are injurious to health"
- 2. The government should impose prohibition on alcohol.
- 3. State have imposed a legal drinking age in their jurisdiction. In some states it is 18 years, while in others it is 21 years and in yet others it is 25 years.

- 4. Under the Motor Vehicles Act, any person found driving with a blood alcohol content of over 0.03% (drunken driving) is penalized. Punishment may even entail a prison term of up to 4 years.
- 5. Advertisement of alcoholic beverages on television is banned in India.
- 6.The Social Justice and Empowerment Ministry has been implementing the Scheme of Prevention of Alcoholism and Substance (Drug) Abuse since the 1980s. This scheme makes use of voluntary organizations (and others) to provide a range of services like identification, counselling, treatment, rehabilitation, creating awareness, etc. 7. A toll-free helpline was set by the centre in 2015 to assist people with regards to substance dependence.
- 8. In 2016, the Supreme Court banned the sale of liquor within 500 m of any national or state highway. In 2004, the National Road Safety Council too had agreed that liquor shops should not be licensed to open shop along national highways.
- 9. The government has set a National Target to achieve a 10% reduction in prevalence of alcohol use by 2025.
- 10. Several state governments have permitted the online sale of alcohol to reduce aggregation of crowds at the liquor shops.
- 11. Recently, on International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking, the centre launched the 'NashaMukt Bharat' campaign to curb alcoholism and drug abuse in India. 272 districts identified as 'vulnerable' are to get treatment and de-addiction facilities.
- 12. India has an international obligation to curb alcoholism as it is signatory to the UN Conventions- Convention on Psychotropic Substances, 1971 and Convention against Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances, 1988.
